PATRICK A'HEARN marks his fourteenth season as a member of the Riverside Center management staff, affording a new dimension and broader outreach to our marketing and artistic endeavors. Mr. A'Hearn was a member of the original Broadway cast of Les Misérables, and can be heard on its original cast recording. He has appeared on Broadway and in the national tours of Les Misérables, Chicago (with Chita Rivera and Ben Vereen), The Phantom of the Opera, The King and I (starring Rudolph Nureyev), The Music of Andrew Lloyd Webber (with Michael Crawford), and Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (with Andy Gibb), as well as in the acclaimed Forbidden Broadway in New York. He was featured in the world premiere of Andrew Lloyd Webber's Requiem Variations, performed as Marvin Hamlisch's principal vocalist in Mr. Hamlisch's Concert Tour, and appeared in concert with Byron Janis, at the Aspen Music Festival, and in concert tours throughout Europe. Additional principal portrayals include Freddy in My Fair Lady with the Portland Opera, Edmonton Opera, and the European tour starring Maximillian Schell, Mr. Snow in Carousel with the Minnesota Opera, and the title role in The Student Prince with Jerome Hines and Christine Andreas. A featured soloist in Broadway Pops programs with major symphonic orchestras throughout the US, Patrick has released two nationally distributed CDs, Patterns of the Heart and By George!-The Music of George Gershwin. He assisted Trevor Nunn and John Caird in the staging of the first national tour of Les Misérables. At Riverside Center, he has appeared in an Actors' Equity Guest Artist capacity as Harold Hill in The Music Man (2006), the Beast in Disney's Beauty and the Beast (2007-08), and the Phantom in Phantom (2012) for which performances he was honored by DC Metro Theatre Arts as "Best Performance by an Actor in a Musical 2012" and by the Maryland Theatre Guide Reader's Poll as "Best Actor in a Musical 2012." His Riverside directing credits include 42nd Street, Evita, Into the Woods, Chicago, The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, Hello, Dolly!, Dreamgirls, Cabaret, The Full Monty, our highly acclaimed production of Les Misérables (for which Patrick received the 2013 award for "Best Director of a Musical" from DC Metro Theatre Arts and the Maryland Theatre Guide Reader's Poll), Gypsy (DC Metro Theatre Arts "Best of 2014 Director of a Musical"), My Fair Lady, The Music of Andrew Lloyd Webber (2015, 2016) which garnered the DC Metro Theatre Arts Award as "Best Musical and Director of a Musical in 2015," Oklahoma! (our 2016 anniversary production), Some Enchanted Evening – The Songs of Rodgers & Hammerstein, Riverside Christmas Spectacular, The Hunchback of Notre Dame, Disney's Beauty and the Beast, A Rockabilly Christmas, Annie (Starring Sally Struthers as Miss Hannigan), Souvenir, A Riverside Family Christmas, The Marvelous Wonderettes, Bright Star, Meet Me in St. Louis, Lerner & Loewe's Carnelot, and Riverside Christmas Spectacular: Home for the Holidays. Patrick most recently directed our soaring production of Ragtime the Musical.

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DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Breadlines, broken ankles, and Broadway: the critical components to one of the most beloved musicals of all time. *42nd Street* tells the tale of a young girl who moves from her small town in Pennsylvania to New York City in the hopes of finding fame and fortune in the chorus of a Broadway show. When tragedy strikes the leading lady, this chorus girl is given minimal time to prepare herself for the role of a lifetime. Based on the 1933 film of the same name, which was based on the 1932 novel by Bradford Ropes, *42nd Street* debuted on Broadway in 1980 and featured unparalleled spectacle and copious amounts of tap dancing.

42nd Street takes place in Manhattan during the Great Depression. While the impacts of the Depression were evidenced across the country, New York City and Broadway felt this turmoil acutely. Already an epicenter of poverty, breadlines were extensive as each day saw more businesses closed, and more people living on the streets. People needed relief and escape. So, while the world may have seemed bleak, performers continued to work tirelessly to entertain audiences who could afford to attend live theater:

The 1930s were also considered to be a part of "Hollywood's Golden Age" and saw the advent of "talkie films." And thus, emerged the movie musical. This new genre took current stage shows and new stories in the style of Broadway Musicals and adapted them for the silver screen. Movie houses popped up across the country (some of which were in old vaudeville theatres). One of the most popular films of the era was the 1933 film *42nd Street* which starred film icons of the 1920s and '30s including Warner Baxter, Ruby Keeler, Bebe Daniels, Dick Powell, and Ginger Rogers. Busby Berkeley, the iconic musical director and choreographer was beginning his career in film. *42nd Street* catapulted him to fame with his kaleidoscopic stage pictures and meticulously precise choreography. This film and the dance elements it featured became the basis for the stage show which would debut in 1980 and then be revised again in 2001.

The original film, *42nd Street*, proved the perfect source material for a Broadway show. It had a solid storyline, a joyous score, fabulous tap numbers, and spectacle beyond anything that had been seen thus far onstage. It soon became the second movie musical ever to be adapted to a full-length Broadway show, and the first to find success. After a nine-year run and nearly 3,500 performances, it sealed its place as the 14th longest-running Broadway show to date. The original production was nominated for eight Tony awards and won two for "Best Musical" and "Best Choreography" in 1981.

At its core, 42nd Street is about the nearly impossible work of making musical theatre, the slang, the industry lingo, auditions, rehearsals, the shaping and cutting of songs and scenes, rampant insecurity, flaring tempers, power plays, "showmances", the whole thing. It's a remarkably accurate portrait of the mechanics, the process, the long and winding road from conception to opening night; as well as the inevitable emotional and psychological potholes in the road when a whole bunch of artists get together: It is also a fable about accepting the path in front of you and throwing yourself into it with all your might – a classic Hero-Myth story.

And at the end of the day, it should be fun and entertaining as well. With this magical cast, and a superb group of creatives, I think we have accomplished that. We hope you agree!

ANDREA M^cARDLE (Dorothy Brock) first captured the hearts of theatergoers everywhere in 1977 when she originated the title role in the mega-musical *Annie*, based on the popular Harold Gray comic strip "Little Orphan Annie". Since then, she has starred in several Broadway musicals and appeared in theatres in New York, nationally and internationally. She has performed in concert halls from Carnegie Hall to the Hong Kong Philharmonic and casino hotels in both Las Vegas and Atlantic City. She has honed her craft by working with some of the great legends of the entertainment industry such as Ethel Merman, Liza Minnelli, Julie Andrews, Bob Hope, Liberace, Frank Sinatra, Steve Martin and Martin Short, to name a few, and was privileged to have appeared on television with Johnny Carson, Merv Griffin and Dinah Shore.

As "Annie", Andrea became the youngest performer ever to be nominated for a Tony Award as Best Lead Actress in a Musical. She also received the Theater World and Outer Critics' Circle Awards for her performance and went on to star when the show was produced on London's West End. (Fun fact: Catherine Zeta-Jones played young orphan Mollie in this production).

Coming full circle, Andrea was tapped by Academy Award nominated director Rob Marshall to appear as "The Star to Be" in the Disney/ABC television production of ANNIE starring Kathy Bates and Victor Garber. And in the summer of 2010, Andrea played, yes, Miss Hannigan in a production at the North Carolina Theatre and at Musical Theatre West in California.

Also on Broadway, Andrea starred in the Jerry Herman musical Jerry's Girls alongside Carol Channing and Leslie Uggams; she portrayed the sassy Smoking Car, Ashley, in Andrew Lloyd Webber's Starlight Express; and starred as Margy Frake in State Fair, as Fantine in Les Misérables and, most recently as Belle in Disney's Beauty and the Beast. She toured nationally starring as Sally Bowles in Cabaret and as Eponine in Les Misérables and appeared as herself in The Vagina Monologues, which she appeared in Off-Broadway as well.

Andrea appeared Off-Broadway in the satirical Newsical and regionally as the title role in Mame and Hello, Dolly! Other theatre appearances include starring as Reno Sweeney in Anything Goes, Esther in Meet Me in St. Louis, Mrs. Johnstone in Blood Brothers, Penelope Pennywise in Urinetown, Sonia in They're Playing Our Song, Luisa in The Fantasticks, Eva Peron in Evita, Nancy in Oliver, the Narrator in Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Annie Oakley in Annie Get Your Gun, Sandy in Grease and as Mama Rose in Gypsy.

In addition to Annie, Andrea's film and television credits include starring as Judy Garland in Rainbow, appearing in The Leading Ladies of Broadway on PBS, All My Children on ABC and headlining her own PBS special Andrea McArdle on Broadway.

Andrea is a much in demand vocalist and has performed in the showrooms of many of the Las Vegas and Atlantic City's top hotels and casinos, and in cabarets and night clubs such as New York City's renowned Joe's Pub at the Public Theatre, Feinstein's, among many others. She can be heard on the Grammy Winning, Platinum selling Original Broadway Cast recording of ANNIE, as well as the cast recordings of *Jerry's Girl's, State Fair,* the television soundtrack of Rob Marshall's *Annie,* as well as her own solo CD titled "Andrea McArdle: On Broadway". In 2013 Andrea released her new solo release ANDREA MCARDLE: 70's & SUNNY- LIVE from 54 BELOW.


